remain consistent. 1. Safety First Broken glass is naturally unsafe. Anybody dealing with the repair should wear heavy-duty work gloves, protective eyeglasses, and closed-toe shoes. If the glass is completely shattered, putting down a tarpaulin or heavy plastic sheeting around the work
