Understanding "Provably Fair" Systems

How Provably Fair Works:

1. **The Server Seed:** The site generates a secret random string before the video game starts and offers the gamer with a hashed (encrypted) version of it.
2. **The Client Seed:** The gamer's web browser generates a random string, or the gamer inputs their own.
3. **The Nonce:** A counter that increases with every bet positioned.
4. **The Outcome:** The combination of the server seed, client seed, and nonce is gone through an algorithm to create the game outcome. After the round, the unencrypted server seed is revealed, enabling the gamer to individually verify that the outcome was not modified mid-game.
